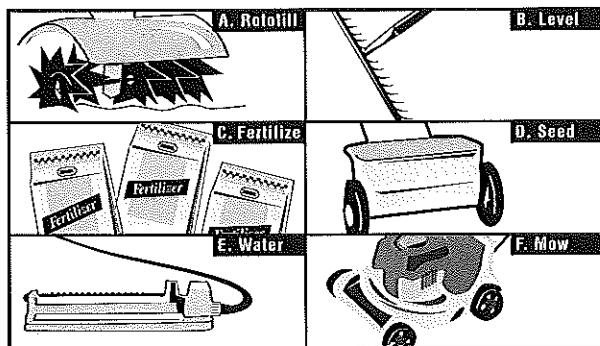


SEEDING YOUR NEW LAWN

Nine Easy Steps To A Beautiful New Lawn

1. Measure the area to be planted, length x width.
Example: 10 ft. times 20 ft. = 200 sq. ft.
2. For new lawn construction, rototill the soil to a depth of 4-6 inches. If you have heavy clay soil, apply a soil amendment such as gypsum, peat moss, or compost at the recommended package rates. Soil should be loose and clod free when properly prepared.
3. Level the seed bed to eliminate high or low spots. Roll to firm the soil.
4. Apply *Bolero*TM Sod and Seed Starter fertilizer as per directions.
5. Sow the grass seed at the recommended rate.
6. Cover the seed with peat moss or seed covering per package directions. Roll the area to place the seed into the soil.
7. Water thoroughly with an oscillating type sprinkler. **KEEP MOIST UNTIL GRASS BEGINS TO SHOW (7-10 DAYS).** Then, decrease watering frequency but increase the length of each watering. This helps ensure a deep rooted, vigorous lawn.
8. New grass seedlings will emerge in 5-10 days after seeding. Do not mow until your new lawn is 3" to 4" tall – usually about 3 weeks from time of planting. Be Gentle! These new plants are very tender – avoid sharp turns with your lawn mower.
9. After the first mowing, fertilize with a quality lawn food. Do not apply weed & feed fertilizers for at least six weeks.

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OVERSEEDING YOUR LAWN

The best way to keep your lawn healthy and vigorous is to OVERSEED it every year.

Follow these instructions for the best results:

1. Mow lawn 1/2" to 1" – remove clippings.
2. Rake hard enough to loosen the soil and break apart the thatch. Remove debris.
3. Fertilize with *Bolero*TM Sod and Seed Starter fertilizer or *Bolero*TM Lawn Food fertilizer (*do not use a weed & feed fertilizer*).
4. Apply seed evenly over the entire lawn at the recommended rate.
5. Water – keep soil moist until the new seed germinates. In about three weeks you will have a thicker, rejuvenated lawn.

LAWN RENOVATION

Q. When and Why to Renovate?

A. *If your lawn is more than ten years old or more than 50% weeds and wild grasses, it is time to start over.*

Follow these easy steps to a beautiful new lawn:

1. Apply a herbicide such as, *Roundup*[®] and wait one to two weeks for the lawn to die and turn brown.
2. Mow the dead grass as low to the ground as possible. Remove the debris.
3. Rent a power rake and remove the remaining debris.
4. Go to step #3 in "Seeding Your New Lawn" and follow through Step #9.

BARE SPOT PATCHING

NOTE: For best results, overseed 3 to 4 feet around the bare spot. This will help "blend" the newly seeded spot with the remainder of your lawn. Bare spots in the lawn can be caused by a number of things: dog spots, dry spots, weed removal, moss removal, etc.

For best results, proceed as follows:

1. Rake spot to loosen soil and remove dead grass.
2. Fertilize the spot to be repaired with *Bolero*TM Sod and Seed Starter fertilizer.
3. Seed the bare spot and cover with 1/4" peat moss or compost.
4. Keep area moist until seed has germinated – approximately 2 to 3 weeks.
